We've just returned from a few days in Washington State, including visits to Meerkerk Gardens on Whidbey Island and to the Rhododendron Species Foundation. Both gardens are beautiful and had a number of plants in bloom e.g. R. strigillosum, R. barbatum, R. mucronulatum, R. neriiflorum etc. The winter of 10/11 has definitely been a challenge for many rhodos in these gardens as well as our own. Many plants have been set back or damaged, largely due to the November cold snap. We took advantage of the situation to assess which large leaf rhodos appeared to be the hardiest, toughest plants. In other words, we created our "wish list" for next year's RSF plant order.

Wildflower Walk

We are planning a trip to the **Honeymoon Bay Ecological Reserve** (formerly the Honeymoon Bay Wildflower Reserve). A small circuit of easy walking trails reveals an abundance of spring wildflowers such as pink fawn lilies, bleeding hearts, violets and white trilliums from April through to the end of June.
