### OUR APRIL SPEAKER EARL DANELUK

### **'SOW SOME SEEDS & GROW SOME NEW RHODOS'**

I will cover many of my experiences during the past 4 years, including both disasters and accomplishments:

- The basic requirements of seed culture and getting them to keep growing.
- What is required in the way of equipment etc.
- Basics of hybridizing.

This will be an easy to understand presentation that should result in a member being comfortable in starting seed and achieving good results. I will have a basic hand-out and some samples of seedlings at different stages.

FYI: currently I am raising about 2,000 seedlings and have recently sowed my current year's crop of approximately 100 different crosses.

Six years ago I knew nothing about rhodos and started with the purchase of 5 plants. Today I have over 1400 rhodos (90% are small 1-2 gallon plants) on my one acre lot in Lantzville.

A note from Bill McMillan:

One of your members asked about rust after the talk. I double checked and it is a kind of fungus, *Chrysomyxa ledi*. They recommend making sure that plants are not close to Sitka Spruce, which is an alternate host. They recommend fungicides for treatment but in the Winter 2011 ARS Journal there is an article on use of Neem oil. It will be reproduced in the next VRS newsletter as well. It apparently controls black spot, powdery mildew and rust fungus. It also repels white fly, aphids and other pests. The oil did wonders for my wife's roses last summer – they had no black spot at all. The article is well worth reading in detail. Thanks, Bill McMillan
