Let's all make a big effort this year with our Christmas get together and auction. Rhododendron's, plants, home made articles, things you think someone will like to purchase, bring them along. KEN GIBSON AWARDED QUEEN'S JUBILEE MEDAL

Congratulations to club member Ken Gibson who was awarded the Commemorative Medal for the Golden Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II. The medal commemorates the fiftieth anniversary of her accession to the Throne as Queen of Canada and was presented to a select group of Canadians in recognition of their achievements. The awards ceremony was held at the Bayside Inn, Parksville on November 12th.

Ken was a long time district councilor in Tofino. He also discovered the location of Fort Defiance on Meares Island, where the Yankee trader Captain Robert Gray camped in the winter of 1791-1792. Fort Defiance is now a protected archeological site. Captain Gray named the Columbia River for his ship, the *Columbia*. The name British Columbia was officially proclaimed in 1858. Club members know Ken best for his service to the American Rhododendron Society for which he and his wife Dot were awarded the ARS Silver medal in 1997.
