

President's Message (continured)

In the garden, it is time for another application of fertilizer for your rhododendrons. I am using 18 - 12 - 14 with micro nutrients and a dose of Epsom salts will help green up the leaves, Some of our rhododendrons may need a shot of dolomite lime to free up the nutrients in the soil. I have started watering where required and its time to get those perennials and annuals into the ground. Don't forget to plant those special rhododendrons which you bought at the plant sale. (Get them into the ground quick before your spouse finds them hiding behind the shed or compost bin.) When I do my planting, I mix compost, canola meal and bone meal into the soil – the rhododendrons love this concoction.

The ARS Annual Convention in Olympia, Washington by Craig Clarke

Joyce & I drove down to the convention April 30- May 4th, stopping on the way at Whitney's Nursery in Brinnon, Washington. There were two prominent international speakers Graham Smith on Pukeiti and Holger Hachmann on hybridizing, who, together with Steve Hootman from the Rhododendron Species Foundation and local garden personalities including Cisco Morris, & Marianne Binetti gave informative & entertaining presentations.

Norman Todd of the Victoria Chapter was presented with the ARS Silver Medal. Milner Gardens was awarded \$3500 US from the ARS Endowment Fund to defray the cost of publishing a booklet on the rhododendron collection at Milner Gardens and Woodland. This continues the work started with a grant received last year from the Stanley Smith Horticultural Trust for the identification, labelling, and interpretation of the Greig Rhododendron Collection.

Richard White entered the truss show and won a 2^{nd} place with **Exquisetum'**. Sandy Campbell won a beautiful rhododendron quilt in the raffle.

The plant sale had a number of new hybrids propagated by Briggs Nursery along with an assortment of species from the Rhododendron Species Foundation. The sale organizers paid for the phytosanitary certificates, making it easy for Canadians to bring home their treasures.
