Trail Mix Cookies

1 cup butter or margarine (I use half and half) 3/4 cup brown sugar 3/4 cup white sugar

2 eggs

1 tsp. vanilla

2 cups flour

1 tsp. baking powder

1 tsp. baking soda

3 cups trail mix of raisins, mixed nuts, chopped dried fruit

1/2 cup raisins

1 cup sliced almonds or walnuts

1 1/2 cup old-fashioned rolled oats

1 1/2 cups of granola mix

Preheat oven to 375 degrees
Mix butter, margarine sugars until creamy
Add vanilla and eggs
Mix flour and soda and baking powder, then
add to mixture

Stir in tail mix, raisins, oats and granola

Shape into ball and place on an ungreased cookie sheet.

Bake for 15 minutes. ENJOY!
