# **Rhodos Worth Growing**

#### Rhododendron 'Crimson Pippin-

(yakushimanum x sanguineum ssp. haemaleum). 2', -23°C, M, 5/4. Silver indumentum and bright currant-red flowers held in loose trusses of 10 with a nice calyx. Compact plant with very deep green leaves and the flowers are the darkest red of any *vakushimanum* hybrid.

**Rhododendron 'Ingrid Mehlquist'** – Besse Howells x degronianum ssp yakushimanum 2-3' -30 °C Frilly white flowers emerge from pinky buds in small but very full and abundant trusses. This is an exceptional rock-hardy yak hybrid with great foliage. The low, compact plant buds heavily from a young age and has been identified in scientific studies as being highly resistant to phytopthera (root rot disease).

**Report on Show and Sale May 3, 2015** Art reported an excellent turnout by the public and thanked all those who participated to make it so successful particularly mentioning Doug Blenkarn and Brenda Lewis for their extraordinary efforts.

Advertising for the show was successful and ads were paid for in the Coffee News for Nanaimo and Central Island as well as ads in the Daily News and The Bulletin. Free advertising was also achieved thanks to Glenda Barr on the CBC and Jan Moles for the rest majority of this work.

Treasurer Krystyna Sosulsky reported that the sale had 9 vendors and grossed\$10,387.55. Following the AGM, Barb and Brian Staton provided an excellent program describing the North Island Rhodo Club's visit to Whidbey Island last year. At executive meetings, we do more than conduct NRS business. We also socialize and often have some great food. Hence the following recipe from the May executive meeting ©

### **Black Bean Sweet Potato Chili**

1 tbsp olive oil
1 medium-large sweet potato, peeled & diced
1 large red onion, diced
3 cloves garlic, minced
1-2 tsp chili powder
1/4 tsp chipotle chili powder
1/4 tsp ground cumin or less
1/4 tsp salt
3 cups vegetable stock
1 x 15 oz can black beans, rinsed
1 x 28 oz can diced tomatoes
1/4 c dried quinoa, rinsed
1/4 c green lentils, rinsed\* if not using add extra 1/4 c. quinoa
\*4 tsp lime juice – (I forgot this when I made it but would add it next time)

Garnish suggestions: avocado, cilantro, grated cheese, sour cream

1 -Heat oil in a heavy bottom pot, add onions & cook for 4-5 min until softened.

2 -Add garlic & spices and stir to combine. Add sweet potato and stir & cook a few minutes

3 -Add stock, tomatoes, black beans & green lentils if desired, stir to combine.

4 - Bring mixture to a boil & cover & simmer for 10 minutes.

5 - Add quinoa & cook until quinoa is fully cooked & sweet potatoes are soft. Add more vegetable

stock if required.

6 - Add the lime juice & remove the pot from the heat. Garnish if desired.

I put this in the slow cooker after I had brought mixture to boil & simmered for 10 minutes. Put quinoa in and left on low for a couple of hours.
