PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I was one of twenty-six eager participants in the first of four species study days at the Rhododendron Species Foundation in Washington State. We spent six packed hours beginning to learn how to key or identify species rhododendrons. The day started out with a hands-on lesson on nomenclature (system of naming), geography and the study of plant structure (morphology). Utilizing examples from the garden picked the previous day by our instructor, Steve Hootman, we then attempted to use keys to identify an unknown rhododenron. After lunch we progressed to studying two of the subsections of the genus, Falconera and Grandia (the "big leafs") using living examples. We spent the remaining hours of the afternoon in the garden itself seeing mature examples of these two subsections. We drove back to Canada, our minds full of information and a widening appreciation for the amazing diversity of the genus rhododendron.


