Garth gave Craig an introduction to WordPress so he is starting to update the pictures and text. A couple of new pictures were added to the page on Rhododendron Lake.

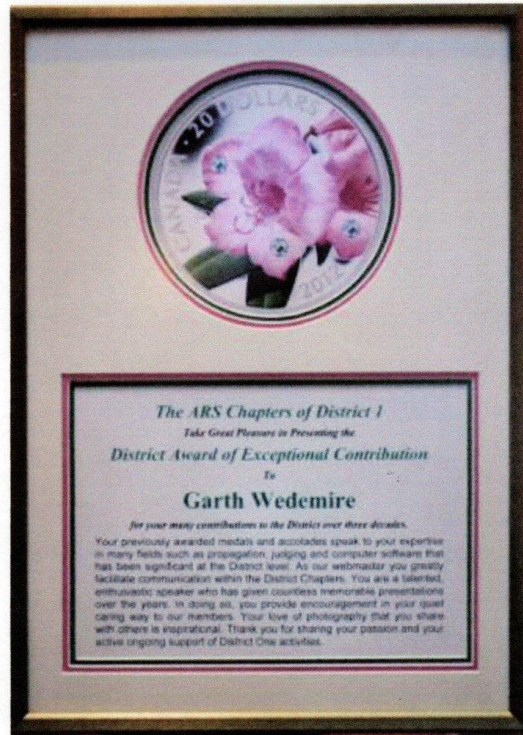
The [Resources](#) tab leads to the club documents page that Art mentioned in his President’s message. Watch for more updates in the months ahead.
