### **Greig Species Garden Update**

It's been another busy spring and summer! In May, we installed temporary shade cloth to protect the newer and smaller plantings. Through the summer, we've had a rotating team of volunteers checking the plantings 3 times each week to monitor their health and sufficient watering. The 500 perennials planted in the spring together with the ever-growing collection of rhododendrons have really started to fill in the garden. In July, we had a Species Garden Advisory Group meeting highlighted by the presentation of a \$4000 US cheque from the A.R.S. The funds will be used to purchase more rhododendrons for the species garden!

### **Raffle Plants:**



### R. "Blaney's Blue" 4/4/4

A vigorous growing, prolific flowering plants reaching 4 to 5 feet in 10 years. The leaves are deep green in summer, changing to bronze tones in the winter. It is hardy to -21C.-4-5'



### R. "Arneson's Gem"

Deciduous azalea with striking yellow-orange fragrant flowers in May. Dramatic color and sweet-smelling flowers are its best qualities. Thrives in full sun where their evergreen relatives tend to burn. Extremely hardy to -34C. Grows to 3 ½ to 4½ feet in 10 years.



### Rhododendron 'Aloha' 3-4/4-5/4

\*\*\*\*\*

A well-rounded plant, which is dense and well branched. It grows to 3 feet in 10 years and is hardy to -23C.

Flowers are openly funnel-shaped, wavy edges, 2¾" across, deep pink fading to pale purplish-pink. Held

in dome-shaped truss of about 19 flowers. Leaves olive green with orange-yellow indumentum, leaves retained 3 years. New growth has white indumentum. Dense, rounded habit (Vulcan x degronianum ssp. yakushimanum, Exbury form).
